

Surprisingly, researchers have not thoroughly studied the impact of PPPs on women's human rights worldwide.

"Corporate Capture of Development" aims to fill this gap by providing new insights from a set of case studies from across the global South.

The examples analysed in this anthology cover a range of sectors, including health, energy, and infrastructure, widely advocating for more robust regulatory frameworks and institutions and indicating how countries could implement changes.

By bringing an intersectional feminist approach to PPPs, these cases enable analysis that can inform advocacy and activism whilst challenging dominant narratives and resisting the negative impacts of PPPs on women and historically marginalised communitie's human rights.
